
TOP CONSIDERATIONS WHEN REPLACING YOUR PACS

1. Functionality

Does the PACS offer all of the tools your team requires, without have an 'over-tooled' and cluttered UI?

5. Vendor Relationship

Does the vendor's approach to client engagement, support, and communication align with your expectations?

2. Workflow

4. Technological Foundation

Is the PACS built on an up-to-date technology platform that is scalable, performant, and secure; can easily adapt to changes in data or usage patterns; and provides robust monitoring and analytics?

6. Cost

Does the PACS fit within your budgetary structure and means, and do the projected capital and operational efficiencies to be gained justify the price tag?



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
